



Who Should Consider Home Care?

Patients and family members consulting with their physician in a variety of situations should consider home care, which accomplishes the following:

- Offers lower cost of care than in hospital or nursing home settings

Home Health Care Defined

Home Care is a health option offering a broad range of medical care and support services provided in the home. Services ranging from simple assistance in the activities of daily living to high tech medical procedures.

Home Care is a cost effective alternative to hospital and nursing home stays.

Medicare patients must meet the definition of homebound. (A considerable and taxing effort to leave home)

Home Health Care Services

Skilled Nursing: Registered Nurses (RN) or Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) provide professional nursing care in the home, working under the direction of the patient's doctor. The nurse implements the plan of care.

Physical Therapy: Therapists work with patients to improve their physical function and daily activities.

Home Health Aides: Aides help patients with personal care services such as grooming, bathing, meal preparation, and light housekeeping.

- Medicare
- Medicaid
- Private Insurance
- Private Pay
- Workman's Compensation
